
# Things to do






## Wild West Coast Access



Crowd-free access to the wild west coast and remote beaches, a fortyfive minute boat ride through Neroutsos Inlet or approximately two to three hours by logging road. Grant Bay



Be back road prepared: Yield to logging traffic, and have a current Backroad Mapbook.

### **Port Alice History**

In the traditional territory of the Quatsino First Nation, Port Alice was originally located 5 km south, where the historic pulp mill stands at the water's edge a century later.

In 1965, the town was relocated to Rumble Beach, and became British Columbia's first instant municipality.

Visible from the Sea Walk, original pilings from a logging float camp line a section of the shore.

Built in 1928, the 9-hole executive golf course sits above the mill, and hidden between is the Old Port Alice Cemetery, with markers dating back to 1917.
