#### Stage 1 - Water Use Restrictions

During Stage 1 restrictions, a person may

water lawns, trees/shrubs/flowers/vegetable gardens using hose-connected or automatic inground sprinklers only if the following conditions are met:



- premises with even numbered addresses on even numbered days
- premises with odd numbered addresses on odd numbered days

Stage 1 restrictions shall be in effect between June 1 and September 30 each year, unless otherwise notified in accordance with this bylaw.

# Village of Port Alice Wood Stove Exchange Program

The Port Alice Wood Stove Exchange Program is designed to encourage residents to exchange their old, inefficient, non-EPA certified wood burning appliances for new EPA-certified wood burning stoves and inserts, and other qualifying appliances Including gas, pellet and electric. (Some exceptions apply).

Port Alice residents who exchange their old wood-burning appliance for one qualified under the Program, are eligible to receive a **<u>\$250 rebate</u>**, providing that the old stove will be decommissioned and recycled.

## **COEXISITING WITH WILDLIFE**

and

#### A Bear Overview

BC is home to one of the highest populations of bears in the world ranging from 120-150 thousand. 14,000—25,000 calls per year are made to Conservation Officers regarding black bears. 60% of these call pertain to garbage.



So what can you do to ensure best waste management practices are being done?

A fed bear is a dead bear!

- Be aware of non food attractants such as kitty litter, diapers, propane, oils and fragrant cosmetics etc.
- Use transfer station hours regularly
- Ensure all garbage bins are firmly latched

Compostable items should be frozen until the morning of pick-up

• BBQ grills and grease pans must be cleaned after use and stored in a secure place

• Make sure to pick up ripe and/or rotten fruit/berries in a timely fashion

#### Myth # 1: Fed Bears Are Tame

False. Fed bears can be more dangerous than wild bears because of their expectations of receiving food from humans.

#### Myth # 2: Bears Hibernate In The Winter

False. Bears are most active between April-November but in milder climates, or where they are continuously finding food bears may not go in their dens.

## Please note:

The green dumpsters are not public garbage bins. They are for use for the commercial and multi -residential buildings that pay to rent them. Our new garbage collection bylaw prohibits the use of other people's garbage containers without permission.

The small Village garbage cans along the sidewalks, at the marina and in the park are not for your household garbage. If you miss your garbage pickup, the transfer station is open 6 days a week and you can drop your garbage off free of charge.

#### **CAMPFIRE:**

Any fire smaller than 0.5 metres high by 0.5 metres wide

REGULATIONS:



You must have ready access to 8 litres of water or a shovel for the entire time your campfire is lit.



Your campfire must be completely extinguished and the ashes must becool to the touch before leaving the area for any length of time. (Hot coals can reignite the fire.)



During campfire prohibitions, only a CSA- or ULC-approved portable campfire apparatus may be used, and the flame height must not exceed 15 centimetres.



You must build a fire guard around your campfire.

#### **GENERAL REGULATIONS:**



Q Yourfire must be extinguished before leaving the area.



Always keep your fire a safe distance away from nearby branches, wood and other combustible materials.

Anyone found in contravention of an open fire prohibition may be fined up to \$345. If your fire escapes and results in a wildfire, you may be fined anywhere from \$100,000 to \$1 million and be sentenced to one year in prison. Please check with



#### CATEGORY 3 FIRE:

- Any fire larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 3 or more concurrently burning piles no larger than 2 metres high by 3 metres wide
- 1 or more burning windrows Stubble or grass burning over an area

#### REGULATIONS:



A fuel break must be established around any Category 3 burn area.



Monitor your open burn to ensure that the fire doesn't spread beyond its intended size.






