Wood Stove Exchange Program



The Port Alice Wood Stove Exchange Program is designed to encourage residents to exchange their old, inefficient, non-EPA certified wood burning appliances for new EPA-certified wood burning stoves and inserts, and other qualifying appliances including gas, pellet and electric. (Some exceptions apply).

Port Alice residents who exchange their old wood-burning appliance for one qualified under the Program, are eligible to receive a **\$250 rebate**, providing that the old stove will be decommissioned and recycled.

Are you planning to replace a Wood or Pellet Stove? There's a **\$250 rebate that can help reduce your costs!**

We seem to have many excited dogs in town that have a lot to say! Barking dog complaints are up at the Village Office, and we'd like to remind owners that persistent barking violates Bylaw 599.

4.07 No person shall permit any dog to bark persistently so as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of the neighborhood or of persons in the vicinity.

Please be considerate of those around you and ensure your pups are not barking consistently, especially early in the morning and late at night.

Also, a good time to remind owners that it is your responsibility to pick up after your pets!



TRANSFER STATION NOTICE

The Village Of Port Alice Transfer Station at the Public Works Yard is for **residential** use only. Contractors must dispose of waste at the 7 Mile Landfill.

Wood waste must be clean.

The Transfer Station does not accept drywall or asphalt roofing tiles.

Everyone can do their part to make the system work, please take the time to separate your waste properly and follow the signage placed around the yard.

Please refrain from flushing any type of disinfecting wipes, flushable wipes, or paper towel down your toilets. This will cause expensive damage to the Sewer System and can create issues for home owners as well.

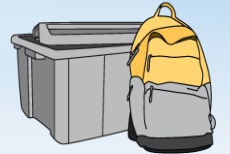
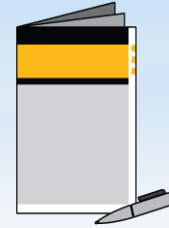

Black Bear

The American black bear (*Ursus americanus*) is the most common and widely distributed of the three bears found in Canada. British Columbia has some of the highest populations of black bears in the world with estimates ranging from 120,000 to 150,000 animals. Most of BC is considered “bear country” with bears living in wide variety of ecosystems.

While called a black bear, these animals come in a variety of colors – everything from the white Kermode bear through to their namesake black and most shades of brown in between. Black bears are omnivorous animals with vegetation

Keeping wildlife wild and communities safe

making up about 80% of their diet. They are renowned for their acute sense of smell that allows them to locate food at great distances.

We can help reduce conflicts with bears by securing attractants and preventing bears from becoming food-conditioned in the first place. It is unfortunate that garbage is reported in 60% of the calls to the Conservation Officer Service when an attractant is identified. While fruit from domestic trees may seem harmless for bears, it leads to food-conditioning and draws them into our communities which increases interactions and conflicts with people. This may make your neighbors, young and young at heart, feel unsafe in their own backyards or using community trails. You can help your community by securing your attractants.

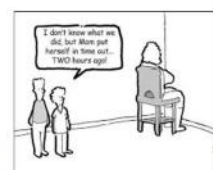
